Assistant Director, Academic Success Program

Brooklyn Law School seeks candidates for the Assistant Director of its Academic Success Program. We anticipate this individual starting employment no later than January 2019. Reporting to the Director, the Assistant Director will:

- Oversee and teach bar preparation courses and programs in both the upper-division curriculum and after graduation;
- Serve a student population composed of accelerated 2-year, traditional 3-year, extended 4-year JD students, and internationally-trained LLM students;
- Assess the efficacy of bar preparation efforts by students, the institution, and vendors and inform the faculty and greater law school community on initiatives to promote greater bar preparation success;
- Assist the Director in overall management of the Academic Success Program.

Applicants must articulate a clear vision for the future of Brooklyn Law School's efforts to provide robust bar preparation for its students. The Assistant Director must stay abreast of developments in the New York bar exam, develop and maintain a high level of knowledge about academic support and bar preparation programs, and have a critical eye for selecting strategic partners and personnel to contribute to the Academic Success Program's bar exam initiatives. The Assistant Director also advises the faculty and administration as to all bar preparation matters and will, alongside the Director, make periodic reports about bar passage.

Most notably, the Assistant Director must have a keen understanding of the academic engagement challenges within the current generation of law students and a viable, thoughtful strategy for addressing them. Moreover, the Assistant Director must demonstrate genuine enthusiasm for working with students who seek or require academic enhancement. Accordingly, the Assistant Director must possess the ability to build meaningful learning relationships with all students.

The salary of the Assistant Director of the Academic Success Program will be commensurate with experience. At a minimum, candidates must possess a J.D. degree from an ABA-accredited law school; bar admission in New York (or a state bar with an equivalent Multistate Bar Exam cutoff); and, at least one year of law teaching experience, preferably in an in-school bar preparation or academic success program (as academic success faculty, staff, and/or as peer educator). This is a one-year faculty appointment, with the possibility of subsequent yearly reappointments and potential eligibility to apply for an appointment on a long-term contract track. We are especially interested in candidates who will enhance the diversity of our faculty.

The deadline for applications is October 26, 2018. Applications should include a cover letter, curriculum vitae, and list of at least three (3) professional references who can attest to an applicant's teaching ability and potential for future teaching excellence. Please send
